RECREATIONAL USE OF GARDEN LANAI

In its meeting of June 30, 2010, the Board approved making the expanded recreation activities permanent.

This is to give our residents a reasonable way to enjoy our 3rd floor green space area, while limiting disturbances for other residents the following was decided:

In order to increase the recreation permitted at 1350 and to protect the safety of building occupants, the building itself and adjacent street traffic, the following activities are permitted on the 3rd floor of the Garden Lanai:

Permitted: Ground or low height games such as:

- (1) Children playing with beach balls or similar objects;
- (2) Putting on the former wading pool area;
- (3) Croquet, Bocce Ball or similar lawn games. Croquet and Bocce Ball sets are available at the front desk.

The following will still **not be permitted**:

- (1) Aerial games and use of other flying objects such as: Frisbees, kites, aerial balls i.e. throwing or kicking baseballs, footballs, soccer balls, etc.;
- (2) Model airplanes;
- (3) Boomerangs.

In addition, the former wading pool has been converted to a putting green.

The Board asks residents to remember that the Garden Lanai is not a public park.. Engaging in those activities which are not permitted, excessive noise, boom boxes, amplifiers, and damage to property or other disturbances to residents will cause the Board to and return to the old restrictions.

FOURTH OF JULY PARTY

As announced in the March 31, 2010 Board's Board, the Board voted to change the format of the Fourth of July Party. In past years, hot dogs, hamburgers, and soft drinks were provided for all who attended and attendees were asked to bring a dish for "Pot Luck". Because the groups were getting larger and the food preparation and service becoming less manageable, the Board decided to invite residents and their guests to bring their own "4th of July picnics" to the Lanai. At any time on the 4th. Cake and coffee will be provided at 8:00, and everyone is welcome to stay to watch the fireworks. We hope that the picnic atmosphere of past years will continue.
